CALL FOR NOMINATIONS FOUR \$25,000 HOMELAND SECURITY AWARDS

February 7, 2010, Auburn, New York - The Christopher Columbus Fellowship Foundation, a Federal government agency, is now accepting Nominations for four 2010 \$25,000 Homeland Security Awards to be presented by the Foundation and AgustaWestland North America, Inc., a Finmeccanica company, one of the largest helicopter manufacturers in the world.



The United States and the world have moved into a new era which necessitates tighter and more vigilant security in all areas. The Foundation and AgustaWestland are doing their part by awarding **four \$25,000 Homeland Security Awards** to American individuals or companies who are making measurable and constructive contributions related to basic or advanced research in the area of homeland security which will result in significant and positive benefits to society.

- 4) *Emergency Response to Natural and Man-made Disasters* Interoperability, emergency command centers, mobile devices (PDAs, cell phones, pagers, Internet.)
