

CALL FOR NOMINATION 2012 AGRISCIENCE AWARDS

The Christopher Columbus Fellowship Foundation, a Federal government agency, is now accepting Nominations for the 2012 *Agriscience Awards*. The awards are presented by the Foundation in partnership with the American Farm Bureau Federation.

The mission of this partnership is to present the Third Annual *Agriscience Awards* to recognize, through **four** monetary awards, one scientist; one current high school educator; and two current high school students who are judged to exemplify excellence in the field of agriscience and to highlight the importance of agriculture in the 21st century.

\$10,000 Distinguished Agriscience Scientist Award

One \$10,000 Distinguished Agriscience Scientist Award will be presented to a scientist who is making or has recently made significant and positive contributions in the field of agriscience.

\$5,000 Agriscience Educator Award

One \$5,000 Agriscience Educator Award will be presented to a current high school educator, with at least five years of teaching experience, and who emphasizes concepts, principles and applications in their curriculum to promote the study of agriscience to students.

\$1,000 Agriscience Student Awards

Two \$1,000 Agriscience Student Awards will be presented to current high school students who are making or have recently made significant and positive contributions related to the study of agriscience.
